## “LEGISLATIVE REPORT”

The delegation of Legionnaires led by Commander Joseph Reale went to Albany for Hill Day. Appointments were set up to meet with the various politicians to discuss the topics that the Legion supports. The Legislators were very responsive to the programs as outlined to them.

A couple of bills in process in Washington:

### 1. Protect Significance -Purple Heart & Bronze Star

Legislation was introduced in the Hoi\use (HR 833), sponsored by Rep. Duncan Hunter of California and the Senate (s. 470), sponsored by Montana Senator Jon Tester, to ensure that the Bronze Star and Purple Heart combat medals rank ahead of a new medal honoring service away from the front lines. The bills are in response to a recent Department of Defense announcement that the Distinguished Warfare Medal will recognize extraordinary achievement of unmanned aerial vehicle pilots and cyber warriors, and will be authorized for wear above the Bronze Star and Purple Heart, both of which are awarded only for battlefield service.

Recognizing valor in combat has profound and significant meaning within the military community and that recognition for non-combat service should not supersede combat-related awards. Numerous leaders of military and veterans organizations signed a letter to President Obama asking his personal involvement to lower the new Distinguished Warfare Medal's standing in the military medals' order of precedence.

In response to these concerns, Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel has directed a 30-day study be conducted to review the policy associated with the new medal.

### 2. Stolen Valor Legislation Advances

The House Judiciary Committee this week approved the “Stolen Valor Act” (H.R. 258, sponsored by Rep. Joe Heck (Nev.). The measure seeks to protect the integrity of military awards by making it a crime to knowingly benefit from making fraudulent claims about military decorations.

In June of 2012, the U.S. Supreme Court overturned a similar law on the grounds that it infringed on constitutionally-protected free speech. The current legislation should withstand constitutional scrutiny because it more narrowly focuses on those who seek to benefit from misrepresentation of military service – not the lie itself. The legislation now moves to the House floor for further consideration.

There were 153 people in attendance and the meal and speeches were excellent. The only mishap was the DJ did not show up. The day started with breakfast with the Department Commander, Department Auxiliary President and the SAL Detachment Commander. There were 32 people in attendance at the breakfast. Next we went to the Cradle of aviation and Nunley's Carousel. Commander Reale took the guests to Eisenhower Park to see the Veterans Plaza. My financial report will be presented in April after I complete it and turn it in to the Treasurer and Finance Committee.

I can say we didn't lose money and the amount expended in November was recovered.

My heartfelt thanks goes out to the Nassau County Auxiliary for all their help and for working together as a Legion Family. My biggest complaint is that the posts and members wait until the last to call for tickets or send in checks. This is not fair to the person chairing the function. The posts were notified 2 months before the dinner and a second letter went out one month before, yet I was receiving checks and calls up to the day before the dinner. These last minute decisions causes stress and extra work on the chairperson. To be truthful, there is no need for this, respond as soon as possible. I hope next year chairperson has better responses and will not face the problem.

## "HOMELAND SECURITY"

I received the following from Homeland Security News: U.S.: Syrian arms high probability. "I have a high probability that chemical weapons were used," Chairman Mike Rogers (R-Michigan) told CNN's Wolf Blitzer. "We need that final verification, but given everything we know over the last year and a half, I would come to the conclusion that they are either positioned for use and ready to do that, or in fact have been used." Rogers and Sen. Dianne Feinstein (D-California), chairwoman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, struck ominous tones in an interview on CNN's "The Situation Room" about the possibility that Syria had crossed what President Obama has said was a "red line" that could lead to the United States getting involved militarily in the conflict.

If the U.S. gets involved militarily that could provoke more attacks by terrorists groups on U.S. soil or U.S. holdings overseas. If you see something that looks out of place or individuals acting suspicious, report it to someone. It is better to be safe than sorry. Remember, Terrorism has many formal definitions. In most cases it involves illegal activity, including use of force or violence directed against the civilian population. It is intended to coerce or intimidate a government or civilian populations or noncombatants in furtherance of terrorist political/social objectives. Terrorism can be domestic, international, state-sponsored or loosely affiliated.

The bottom line is "ALWAYS BE ALERT AND IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING".


**LONG ISLAND NATIONAL CEMETERY**
