“LEGISLATIVE REPORT”

Six members from Nassau County traveled to Hill Day in Albany. They were, Commander Colon, William Ost, Joe Reale, Andy Booth, Charles Mills and myself. It was a very productive couple of days. We meet with Senator Skelos and we discussed various items but one that was important was the cut in the budget for Stony Brook State Veterans Home. The Senator stated he had already met with the Governor and the \$4.5 million taken out of the budget will be reinstated, they are still discussing the remainder of the budget along with the other four State Veterans Homes.

Five of us attended the session of the Senate as guests of Senator Skelos. This session was called Senate Veteran Hill Day. Several bills concerning veterans were passed, Bill S3901 called “The Specialist Thomas Wilwerth Military Dignity Act”, named after an Iraqi War veteran from Long Island. This would limit protests within 2500 feet of military services, funerals and processions of deceased service members unless the protest organizers post a bond to the local municipality to defray the increased costs associated with the demonstration that occur closer to these funeral activities. The bond will be \$5000 to \$25000. In no case would the protestors be permitted within 500 feet of funeral activities and they would also have to apply for a permit with the New York State Division of Military and Naval Affairs. The other bills passed are:

1. Bill S.2421 would require that absentee or military ballots of any active duty service member be counted even if such service member dies before the date of the election for which it was cast.

2. Bill S.2424A establishes the New York State Veterans Cemetery Act and provides the mechanism for the establishment of a New York State Veterans Cemetery Program.

3. Bill S.3484 extends provisions establishing a recruitment incentive and retention program in the form of a tuition reimbursement for certain active members of the New York Army National Guard, Air National Guard and Naval Militia.

4. Bill S.1728 would create the crime of “Cemetery Desecration of a Veteran” and also allows community service to be provided for desecrated cemeteries as a condition for probation or conditional release.

5. Bill S.1504 would prohibit the unauthorized sale of veterans’ commemorative property, including artifacts, statues or other physical memorabilia from a cemetery, in order to preserve history and provide for continued reverence of those who faithfully served our country.

6. Bill S.1431 directs the Adjutant General to present a U.S. flag to the person disposing of the body of a member of the National Guard, Air National Guard or a Naval Militia who dies in the service of their state and nation.

7. Bill S.656 allows the State Department of Environmental Conservation to organize fishing events that provide physical or emotional rehabilitation for veterans or active duty members of the armed forces, without the need for veterans or active duty members to obtain fishing license.

These Bills’ were forwarded to the assembly and when passed will be forwarded to the Governor for signature.

PROTOCOL COMMITTEE

The Protocol Committee (4 out of 5) met in response to a question from the Convention Committee concerning Distinguish Guests for the Convention. The Protocol Committee provided the Convention Committee with their findings.

Advisory from National Guard Bureau (NGB)

The following is an advisory sent out by the National Guard Bureau (NGB) in reference to a group called "Veterans Affairs Services"

An organization called Veterans Affairs Services (VAS) is providing benefit and general information on VA and gathering personal information on veterans. This organization is not affiliated with VA in any way. Websites with the name "VA services" immediately after the "www" ARE NOT part of the Department of Veterans Affairs; the real VA website ends in.gov. If approached or called, do not offer them any information concerning yourself or data on other veterans. The Department of Veterans Affairs does not randomly call veterans, nor does it ask veterans for information which it does not already have. If you have not dealt with the VA previously and in person, then you receive a call from someone saying they are with the VA or something similar sounding, hang up the phone. Do not respond to emails which suggest that they are from the VA. The VA never conducts official business nor asks for personal information by email.

VAS may be gaining access to military personnel through their close resemblance to the VA name and seal. NGB Legal Counsel has requested that the NGB Provost Marshal Office coordinate with DoD to inform military installations, particularly mobilization sites, of this group and their lack of affiliation or endorsement by VA to provide any services.

BOYS STATE PROGRAM

I have only 30 applications handed out or called for. There are posts that have said they want applications but have not come forward with the money. I need completed application back to me by 15 April, the schools go on Spring Break the following week and the boys will not be able to get the applications signed by the school. I have posts that took boys last year but have not taken any this year. There are still 20 applications available. Get your boys picked and send me a check for \$400 per boy and I will deliver the packets. There are changes to the packets and application form and I will cover this with you when I give you the packets. Boys state runs 26 June thru 1 July. All applications must be completed and returned to me no later than 15 April. If your post can not get a boy from your local schools I always have boys needing sponsorship, call me. "HOMELAND SECURITY & DISASTER PREPAREDNESS"

Each County and each Post in the County should have a chairman for Homeland Security and Civil Preparedness. The County Chairman is being asked to compile a list of names of all the Post Chairmen in their respective County. This list should be forwarded to the District Chairman, who will compile the District list and then forward it to the Department Chairman. Each post should forward their chairman's name to their County Chairman.

Homeland Security is not only about Terrorism, it covers disasters such as, floods, hurricanes, train derailments, fire, snowstorms etc. The posts and CERT personnel can be a tremendous help in times of emergency. The cornerstone of preparedness and prevention is AWARENESS for all hazards. The skills, training and education that veterans have make your observations and involvement even more critical. We are now learning of more cases of home grown terrorism, with the U.S. getting involved in a third confliction in an Arab Country protests are on the rise. These protests are good cover for homegrown terrorist or other to infiltrate so we must be ever alert. You must be alert at all times and if you see something tell someone.

Terrorism has many formal definitions. In most it involves illegal activity, including use of force or violence directed against the civilian population. It is intended to coerce or intimidate a government or civilian populations or noncombatants in furtherance of terrorist political/social objectives. Terrorism can be domestic, international, state-sponsored or loosely affiliated.

The bottom line is "ALWAYS BE ALERT AND IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING".

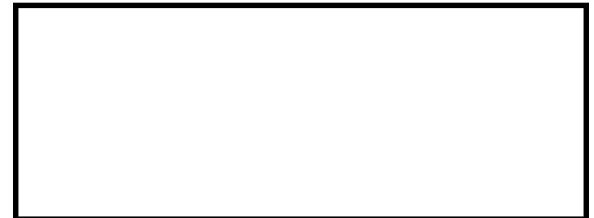
