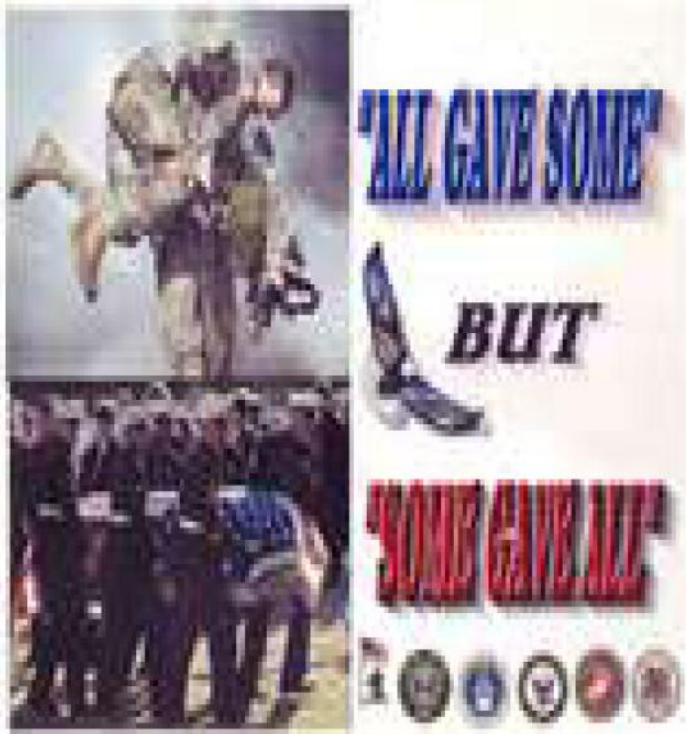
**REMEMBER TO SEND IN

Each Post in the County should have a chairman for Homeland Security and Civil Preparedness. The County Chairman is being asked to compile a list of names of all the Post Chairmen in their respective County. This list will be forwarded to the District Chairman, who will compile the District list and then forward it to the Department Chairman. Each post should forward their chairman's name to the County Chairman. Include with the name, phone number, address and e-mail address (if one is available). To date only 10 posts have forwarded this information.

There are many incidents of naturally disasters in the U.S. at this time. The worst disaster is in Joplin Ms. and it is the most deadly tornado in the history of the U.S. We must be prepared at all times as with the weather being so crazy we could be hit at any time. One son was killed in action, her other son came home, but through the years suffered from various ailments and was going back and forth to Northport Hospital in the DAV Vans. Ann mentioned at various times how she appreciated this service. Eventually four vehicles were purchased. They were dedicated in honor of Ann, with a "Gold Star Mother" decal and Ann Gallagher's name installed on the units.

Members of the American Legion Post 1087 and Auxiliary attended the dedication of the first two vehicles and the following year the second dedication for the remaining two.

Ladies Auxiliary and Cathedral Post 1087 members were Proud to have Ann as an active member for so many years.

BOYS STATE PROGRAM

I have 40 boys going to Boys State this year, which could be reduced to 39 due to an error by the Principal of Chaminade. He wrote that the boy had an 88 average but was not in the top 50% of the class. This statement will cause his application to be rejected. Working with the boys father, school guidance counselor and his history teacher we discovered he is ranked 80 out of 419 and is actually in the top 20% of this class. The Principal of Chaminade called me and I put him in touch with Dick Pedro. Dick Pedro on Wednesday was in a conference with Fang Wong and could not be reached, on Thursday he went to the Oxford VA for a meeting and then went home for the weekend. The Principal and I will each contact him on Tuesday and try to reverse this rejection.

The Boys State Orientation will be on Thursday 9 June at 8 P.M. at the Williston Post #144 and the bus will pick and drop off the boys at the Williston Post. The boys depart by 6 A.M. on Sunday 26 June and return about 1:30-2:00 P.M. on Friday 1 July. I want to THANK all the posts that are sending boys and Williston Post for use of their hall.

SUPPORT FOR TROOPS ON ACTIVE DUTY

Packages are still being shipped as we received an abundance of socks and t-shirts plus other toiletry items. In May I shipped 15 boxes and I am still packing more, I hope to exhaust my supply by the end of June.

I responded to a request for Family Support for a Marine stationed on Long Island. His request went to National who forwarded to the Department who forwarded to me. He is asking for help to pay his lawyers fees in a messy divorce but the system is not geared for that. He also needed other assistance until he went back to court and they are now working on the divorce and it will probably end with each one getting of one child each. This ended the request and until everything is finalized there is no need for assistance. A second request came in and it was from a disabled veteran who served from 1994 until 1998. The disability was not service connected. He and his wife stated they were being evicted from their apartment. After investigation it turns out the landlord threaten eviction but had not started anything. The couple owes four months back rent (\$4300). I checked out routes to follow and passed on to them the telephone number and address of the Social Services Department the handles eviction and homeless. I have not heard anything since then.

“LEGISLATIVE REPORT”

As of May 16, 2011 the 2012 Defense Authorization Passes House Panel by a vote of 60-1. It is a big bill and covers Tricare, SBP/DIC Offset, War on terror, Don't Ask, Don't Tell and many others. The War on Terror includes language reauthorizing the president to conduct the war on terror and expands it to cover any terrorist group besides Al Qaeda. Don't Ask, Don't Tell voted 36-27 to require the service chiefs to sign off on it before it becomes official.

I have asked Ken Cadieux to put a release from National in the Legionnaire. This release states that The American Legion stands firm in support of Blue Water Navy veterans' claims of Agent Orange exposure.

Temporary Financial Assistance

In the 1920s, The American Legion family raised more than \$5 million to create the National Endowment Fund. One of the programs created through the Endowment Fund was Temporary Financial Assistance. Through grants, TFA keeps children of deceased or disabled veterans at home rather than in institutions. This cash aid is still available for cases not covered by subsequent state and federal programs for the needy. In 2010, the program provided more than \$515,000 to 640 families, benefiting 1,408 children.

Through TFA, a local post can request cash assistance to help maintain the basic needs of veterans' children. The fund helps families meet the costs of shelter, food, utilities and health expenses when parents are unable, thereby keeping the child or children in a more stable home environment.

Make a donation

You can donate to the Temporary Financial Assistance program by sending a check or money order, made out to The American Legion Endowment Fund, P.O. Box 1055, Indianapolis, IN 46206

Who is eligible? Eligibility is limited to minor children of veterans. The parent must have served at least one day of active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States during one the following periods:

- Dec. 7, 1941-Dec. 31, 1946
- June 25, 1950-Jan. 31, 1955
- Feb. 28, 1961-May 7, 1975
- August 24, 1982-July 31, 1984
- Dec. 20, 1989-Jan. 31, 1990
- Aug. 2, 1990-Cessation of hostilities as determined by the U.S. Government.

Membership in The American Legion is not required.

- Minor children include any unmarried child, stepchild and adopted child 17 years or younger.
- Children 18-20 years old will be considered if a current disability requires special schooling or indefinite in-home care, or they are enrolled in an approved high school.
- No child is considered eligible for TFA until a complete investigation is conducted, a legitimate family need is determined, and all other available resources have been utilized or exhausted.
- TFA applications must originate and be investigated at the local level. When all other possible resources have been exhausted, contact your local American Legion post, department headquarters, and/or department Children & Youth chairman.
