The House of Representatives and Senate have returned from their summer vacations. The Flag Amendment is being pursued, the House versions as 62 Congressman and women signed on and the Senate version has 21 Senators signed.

On the state level:

The Funeral Protection Legislation that passed both the Assembly and the Senate was laid on Governor Cuomo's desk last week. These two pieces of legislation will create a statewide buffer zone at funerals to protect against disruptions and disturbances as well as allowing localities to establish a permitting procedure for those who wish to protest at a funeral. The Governor signed them.

"HOMELAND SECURITY"

Homeland Security is not only about Terrorism, it covers disasters such as, floods, hurricanes, train derailments, fire, snowstorms etc. The posts and CERT personnel can be a tremendous help in times of emergency. The cornerstone of preparedness and prevention is AWARENESS for all types of terrorism or natural disasters. The Holiday season is coming shortly, the shopping malls will be busy and people will be preoccupied, this is the time to "STAY ALERT" and if you see something report it. The skills, training and education that veterans have make your observations and involvement even more critical.

Terrorism has many formal definitions. In most it involves illegal activity, including use of force or violence directed against the civilian population. It is intended to coerce or intimidate a government or civilian populations or noncombatants in furtherance of terrorist political/social objectives. Terrorism can be domestic, international, state-sponsored or loosely affiliated. The bottom line is "ALWAYS BE ALERT AND IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING".

LEGISLATIVE BREAKFAST"

The Legislative Breakfast was held on Sunday 09 October 2011 at 9 A.M. at the Williston Post #144, 730 Willis Avenue, Williston Park, NY. We invited 20 Legislator and we had 5 saying no, one no response and 14 say they would be there. Only 8 of the 14 showed up and we had only State Legislators, as 2 Federal had said no and 2 said yes but did not show. We introduced the NEW County Veterans Service Director and he did speak, he was appointed on the Friday before the breakfast. We also Had a Representative of County Executive say a few words. We only sold 89 tickets and had 25 guests. The total income was from tickets was \$2120 and from the raffle was \$331 and expenses were \$1544.95 plus \$60.42 which showed donations to be \$845.63. This breakfast was tasked to raise \$100 so we were short \$154.27 of that goal. Quite a few posts that normally support the breakfast did not come forward this year. This also affected the raffle as the income was low and the amount of bottles was low.

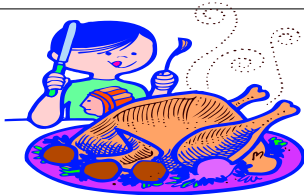
