If any knows of a service person in Iraq or Afghanistan please contact me with the name and address and I will send items to them. If you are planning to ship packages to the servicemen and women in Iraq or Afghanistan do it before November 10<sup>th</sup> to ensure it will arrive before Christmas. I received another \$20 donation from the individual in the Carle Place post #1718, his total is over \$340 to date. I am contacting the Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in Germany to make a donation and check on sending phone cards. I will also check Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington DC.

Each Post in the County should have a chairman for Homeland Security and Civil Preparedness and that name should also be forwarded to County Chairman and Department Headquarters.

**"HOMELAND SECURITY"**

Homeland Security is not only about Terrorism, it covers disasters such as, floods, hurricanes, train derailments, fire, snowstorms etc. The posts and CERT personnel can be a tremendous help in times of emergency. A good example of this is the fires in California. The cornerstone of preparedness and prevention is AWARENESS for all hazards. The State of California was well prepared and they are doing a tremendous job. It requires everyone's help. The skills, training and education that veterans have make your observations and involvement even more critical. Watch for suspicious activity...if you see something, say something.

Terrorism has many formal definitions. In most it involves illegal activity, including use of force or violence directed against the civilian population. It is intended to coerce or intimidate a government or civilian populations or noncombatants in furtherance of terrorist political/social objectives. Terrorism can be domestic, international, state-sponsored or loosely affiliated. The bottom line is "ALWAYS BE ALERT AND IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING".

## OVERSEAS HOLIDAY MAILING 2007:

Officials at the Military Postal Service Agency in Washington have established dates by for sending mail from the United States to overseas military mailing addressees for the holidays. In order to get holiday gifts to deployed service members by 25 DEC, mailers should heed the U.S. Postal Service's suggested deadlines. Parcel post packages to deployed troops and those living on overseas installations should be sent by 13 NOV. Customers missing the parcel post deadline have the following options: Space-Available Mail (SAM) - 27 NOV; Parcel Airlift Mail (PAL) - 4 DEC (except for ZIP codes starting with 093, which is 1 DEC); Priority Mail and first-class letters and cards - 11 DEC (093 ZIP codes: 4 DEC); Express Mail Military Services - 18 DEC (not available to 093 ZIP codes). Parcel post packages sent to arrive by the start of Hanukkah at sundown 4 DEC should be mailed by 23 OCT. For other Hanukkah mailings, subtract 21 days from the deadlines listed above.
